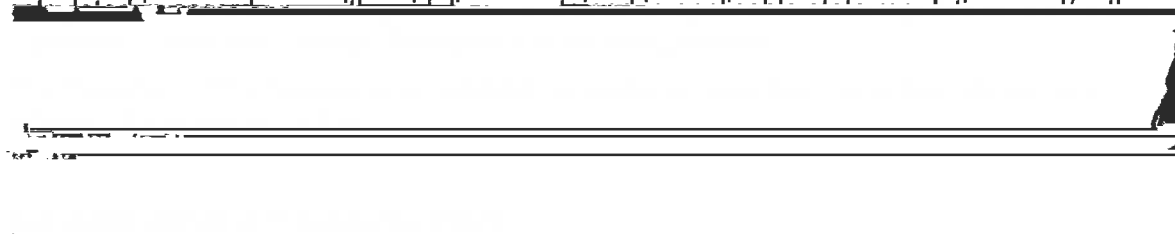
## **BP 5020      Nonresident Tuition**

Nonresident students shall be charged nonresident tuition for all units enrolled.

Not later than January 1 of each year, the President of the College shall bring to the Board for approval an action to establish nonresident tuition for the following fiscal year. The fee shall be



## BP 5020 Non-Resident Tuition

Education Code Sections 68050, 68051, 68130, 68130.5, 76001, 76140, 76114.1, and 78032 (d);  
Title V Section 54045.5

Non-resident students shall be charged non-resident tuition for all units enrolled, unless specifically required otherwise by law.

Individuals qualifying for programs under AB 2264 are considered exempt non-residential
