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1. Preamble

Human research, including research with or about people or their data, is governed by ethical principles embedded in codes and legislation. History has shown that unethical research conduct can harm participants and erode the public trust in research. It is time to reflect public expectations about the conduct of human research and to ensure that human research is conducted for people. This Procedure details the mechanisms set in place by the University to ensure that human research is conducted to minimise the risk posed to participants and the broader community while affirming the right of researchers to carry out research.
