Women and girls comprise a large segment of the refugee population where they are most often represented in policy and practice as a vulnerable minority. Their capacity to contribute to solutions of displacement is often unrecognized and gender equality is an essential goal. Despite the comprehensive nature of policies adopted to address the protection needs of refugees and women and girls, it is acknowledged that they still suffer from endemic rape and gender-based violence (SGBV), which is both a cause of and a major barrier to gender equality. This presents significant challenges to many critical protection measures, such as gender information, decent work, health and education, which are basic requirements for self-reliance and sustainable development. Solutions must be found to allow all vulnerable groups, including men and boys, to benefit. The immense social and economic capital and capacities of refugees and women and girls are often underutilized and their voices are silenced. Major barriers block their access to participation in men and boys. While significant progress has been made, women and girls remain a risk and their potential in solving problems is largely unexplored.

A gender analysis of the findings and recommendations of the High Commissioner's Dialogue, undertaken by UNSW in partnership with UNHCR, Gender Equality Unit and SGBV Unit. The New York Declaration includes a strong and clear statement of commitment to refugee women and girls. The aims of the Gender Analysis are to ensure that the different types of gender needs of women and girls, men and boys are recognized through the Global Compact on Refugees (GCR). Specifically, a statement of principle in the preamble of the Comprehensive Refugee Response Framework (CRRF) and action points in each pillar of the Programme of Action (PoA). Additionally, it is proposed that the recommendations made by all stakeholders and which cross-cut all four pillars be included in a preamble to the PoA.

One clear outcome of the Gender Analysis is that gender equality and the differences experienced by women and girls, men and boys are often not fully understood. The impact of SGBV is often not fully recognized because it is often seen as separate from the issue of gender equality and the two are often linked. Women and girls are often seen as separate from the main programs. The recommendation is to include some specific agencies and other stakeholders in the implementation of the PoA. Despite the many challenges, UNHCR has integrated SGBV prevention and response work into its standard operating procedures, dedicating staff to the Safe Space programme. Monitoring and evaluation and information management systems have been established. These must be strengthened to ensure that SGBV does not become just another acronym in a list of acronyms and that the impact of endemic rape and gender-based violence on the achievement of gender equality will be effectively addressed.
