It is with great pleasure that I write to you all today. I would like to start off by saying thank you for this opportunity to serve alongside each of you for the 2017-2018 academic year. I will be proud to inform students not only about our clubs here on the main campus, but also about the opportunities within ASGC and Inter Club Council (ICC).

When reading over the ICC's bylaws, I was surprised to see that there was no conflict-resolution policy currently in place. Thus, bringing us to protection: Focused on collaborating with the ICC and ASGC members, my hope is that we will create and implement both a conflict-resolution and a zero-tolerance for bullying policy. This is a goal I feel is readily achievable w

In the next month, I will be attending club meetings to establish a point of contact for all things clubs here at Gavilan College. I plan to share with each club my goals during my term as VP of Clubs.
